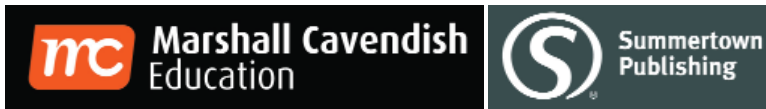

12:30 **Something for Everyone!** Andy Cowle

*Do you prefer to teach lots and lots of grammar? Or do you need to build vocabulary? Or do you need to focus on certain skills? Or do you seek a good balance of all these things? ELT coursebooks have a duty to support teachers, providing a full syllabus of grammar, vocabulary and skills work, but also to help them meet varied needs and recognise varied learning styles. This practical session looks at Jeremy Harmer's 4-level general English course Just Right, its language and key principles, and how the teacher can pick and choose material to suit the different levels, learning styles and language needs of adults and young adults.*

*Learning and practising grammar is only meaningful and memorable if this is done in context. The session looks at how grammar can be presented and revised using texts and exercises (including audio) which are interesting and place the language in real contexts. The session looks at grammar points from Real English Grammar which covers topics such as the arts, history, literature, science, geography, biology etc., and includes audio input from the CDs. 14:45 **English for Business Life** Andy Cowle

*A good business English textbook needs to be genuinely flexible and easy to customise to meet students' needs.
