Alina Kabayeva has been a European champion four times and a world champion twice. She has also become a symbol of beauty in Russian sport. In fact, due to her high cheekbones, large, sparkling eyes and appealing smile, she was made Miss 'Widest Smile' 2002. The only thing Alina doesn't have is an Olympic Medal ...yet!

Garry Kasparov started playing chess when he was five years old. He became an Olympic champion seven times and won a multiboard chess tournament with national teams of many countries. His greatest achievement was in 1996, when he defeated an IBM computer in a chess competition. Garry's handsome face, high forehead and thick eyebrows are signs of his extraordinary talent and generosity.
